Dear Friends and Parishioners,

On the 18th of December 2023, a Declaration on the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings, named *Fiducia Supplicans* was published by the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith at the Vatican. This Declaration caused quite a stir, as some thought that is signalled a reversal in Catholic teaching regarding marriage and same-sex relationships. Some parishioners have



asked me about this, and I promised to write about it in the church bulletin. Since it was close to Christmas, I put it on the back burner.

You may read the Declaration (of about 10 pages) from <u>www.vatican.va</u>. It is very clear that there is no reversal of teaching regarding marriage, but there is a broader and better understanding of the concept of blessing.

The Declaration *remains firm on the traditional doctrine of the Church about marriage.* It does not allow any type of liturgical rite or blessing like the liturgical rite of marriage, because that could create confusion. However, *it offers a specific and innovative contribution to the pastoral meaning of blessings.*

As a result, one can understand and respond positively to the possibility of blessing couples in irregular situations and same-sex couples without officially validating their status or changing in any way the Church's perennial teaching on marriage.

Pope Francis reiterates Catholic teaching, stating that a marriage is always an "exclusive, stable, and indissoluble union between a man and a woman, naturally open to the generation of children". He adds that something that is not marriage cannot be recognised as marriage" (Ficudia Supplicans para 4). In a few words, a blessing is permitted and even encouraged, but it cannot be seen as a marriage.



First Reading:

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."'

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

Gospel:

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.
