Gospel :

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

When all the people asked John. 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

EDUCATION IN FAITH

Getting ready

In Luke's Gospel possessions represent a person's spiritual state. Those who truly welcome Jesus would give up everything in order to follow him. Verses 10-14 of this passage, found only in this Gospel, highlight the proper use of possessions. In order to prepare for whatever is about to happen, people must show with their material possessions that they are spiritually ready. Even if someone has only two shirts or two loaves of bread, that's a shirt and a loaf they could give to someone else.

Tax collectors and soldiers

Tax collectors could force people to pay more than they owed. The tax agents then pocketed the extra earnings. Tax collectors could also call upon soldiers to force people to pay. The soldiers would have been paid for their help.

Messiah

Messiah is a Hebrew word that means anointed one. Christ is the Greek word for the same thing. In the ancient world people were anointed as a sign that God had chosen them for a special purpose.

Expectations

Given the Roman occupation of their land, many Jews were looking for a messiah to liberate them. As John urged people to turn away from their old lives and embrace God's coming, people hoped that he was God's chosen one. In response, John distinguishes himself from the one who is coming.

- John immerses people into water; the one who comes will fill people with God's Spirit
- John's baptism is only a sign of change; the one who comes will bring about real and decisive change
- It was a slave's job to remove his master's shoes. John isn't even worthy to act as a slave for the one who is coming

With fire

John evokes Malachi 3:19 when he warns that God's judgment includes a fiery purging. John describes a farmer tossing wheat into the air to separate it from the chaff, the inedible part. It's not clear if the chaff refers to people or to whatever is in people that must be purged before they enter God's kingdom.
